FPL's Book Sale Raises More Than \$1,400

Portland was buzzing with excitement and plenty of activity on Friday, October 24. Along with the costumed trick-or-treaters enjoying Portland's Halloween Downtown event, book enthusiasts lined up at the Library for FPL's Annual Book Sale.

The Friends held another successful book sale that weekend (October 24-26), and raised \$1,400 to support Library programs. The Annual Book Sale, which is FPL's largest fundraising event (other than the Membership Drive), is a much anticipated event for many area residents. It's a great opportunity to stock up on reading material for the upcoming long winter season. With blizzards, a hurricane, a tropical storm and extended power outages in recent years, it's always a good idea to have a good supply of reading material on hand!

We received a good quantity of high quality donated materials at our four Read & Recycle collection events this year, so setting up the Book Sale was quite a challenge. Our small but eager group of volunteers worked in earnest Thursday afternoon and evening to move the books from our storage facility to the Library, where they were quickly loaded on to tables.

Sales were steady throughout the weekend, and the Friends donated all remaining books, games, puzzles and audiovisual materials to Goodwill Industries and to local schools, who will use these materials to supplement their programs.

The Friends would not be able to run a successful Annual Book Sale without our volunteers. This year's volunteers included students from St. Mary's CCD program, PMS, PHS and staff from the Public Works Department and the Portland Library. Many thanks to Portland Fire Department Company #1 for the use of their tables and to Portland Library and BIS for the use of their facilities. Finally, we would like to thank the many Friends' members who spent countless hours organizing, planning and executing the event.

The Portland Schools Youth Art Exhibit will grace the Mary Flood Room during the months of March and April. The Exhibit will feature art by talented students from all five Portland Public Schools. A reception will be held for the students, their families, teachers and friends on Thursday, March 12 from 4-6 PM at the Library.

Christopher Graham will present his photography show entitled *Portland – From a Different Light* at the Library during the month of May. Chris specializes in long exposure and high dynamic range photography and brings a unique and exciting perspective to familiar objects and locations around town. Chris has also photographed several hidden Portland gems that may be new to most residents. A reception date will be announced in the Library newsletter and in the *Rivereast News Bulletin*.

FPL Supports Art and Culture in Portland

Are you looking to add some art and culture to your life? Local residents can experience both by taking advantage of various Library programs funded by the Friends of the Portland Library. For example, you can pick up Museum Passes at the Portland Library that provide free admission to five excellent art museums. You also can view an art show or attend one of FPL's Artist Receptions in the Library's Mary Flood Room. Perhaps you could choose a DVD of your favorite opera, Broadway show or classic movie from the Library's extensive DVD collection. Or attend one of the many FPL-funded art, music or literature programs offered for adults or children at the Library.

FPL's Museum Pass Program provides free admission to four outstanding Connecticut art museums. Hartford's Wadsworth Atheneum, America's oldest public art museum, boasts an impressive collection of European, American and Contemporary art, along with an extensive Costume and Textile Collection. At the 152 acre Hill-Stead Museum in Farmington, you can experience paintings by Degas, Cassatt, Whistler and Monet and wonderful ceramics and furniture, all set in the Pope family's comfortable and livable home. The New Britain Museum of American Art, the first museum dedicated strictly to American Art, now has a collection of over 10,000 pieces that spans from John Trumbull to Georgia O'Keefe and beyond. Or you can visit the home of American Impressionism and the famous Lyme Art Colony at the Florence Griswold Museum in Old Lyme.

FPL recently added The Eric Carle Museum of Picture Book Art to our stable of free art museum passes. Located just one hour north of Portland in Amherst, Massachusetts, The Carle is the only full-scale museum in the United States that collects, preserves, presents and celebrates picture books and picture book illustrations from around the world. The pass provides free admission for two adults and up to four children per visit. FPL's Museum Pass Program is funded entirely by the Friends at a cost of \$2,500 per year. The Library's Mary Flood Room not only serves as the main venue for Town meetings and community groups, but also as the home of art shows by talented local artists. Recent shows include works by members of Brownstone Arts (a local artists' group) and Paula Slym, a Portland artist who works in acrylic and watercolors. FPL sponsors an Artist Reception for each art show, and beverages and homemade baked goods are always served. See the article on Page 4 for a description of upcoming shows.

FPL funds the entire cost of Portland Library's impressive DVD collection at a cost of approximately \$12,000 per year. From *Anna Karenina* to *Annie Hall*, from *Great Opera Arias* to performances from *The Grand Ole Opry*, from *Swan Lake* to *Duck Soup*, the Library's collection contains something for everyone.

FPL finances many children's, family and adult programs throughout the year. In 2014, FPL has funded Library programs on puppetry, chocolate, music, the science of bubbles, magic, acrobatics, Zentangle (a Zen inspired art form) and the role of women in the World War II workforce. We also fund both the Children's and Adult Summer Reading Programs as well as provide refreshments, supplies and prizes for children, teen and adult programs held throughout the year. All told, FPL budgeted \$10,000 for these programs in 2014.

All of these programs are possible only because of the generous support of our members. With tight Library budgets in recent years, FPL's role has become more crucial than ever. Please join FPL (or renew your membership) by sending in the enclosed membership form today. With your help, Portland Library will continue to serve as a vital resource for art and culture in our community.

Find Bargains at the Friends' Second Hand Prose Bookshop

When visiting the Library, be sure to browse the Friends' Second Hand Prose Book Sale area. We have mysteries, general fiction, non-fiction, romance, young adult and children's used books, as well as used DVDs and videos. Many items are like new and would make great gifts. Hardcover books sell for \$2.00 and trade paperbacks (such as those from Oprah Winfrey's book club selections) cost \$1.00. Paperbacks and books for children and young adults sell for \$0.50. DVDs cost \$3.00 and videos sell for \$1.00. We also sell discarded books from the Library's collection for only \$0.50 each. New treasures arrive each week!

FPL also holds several targeted book sales in the Second Hand Prose Bookshop during regular library hours throughout the year. In February, when "Love is in the Air" at the Portland Library, we offer hundreds of romance novels for sale. During June and July, patrons can stock up on paperback books for their vacation reading at the annual Books for the Beach sale. The Holiday Book Store, which is held on the first Saturday in December, starts our month long sale of gift quality used books including coffee table books and children's holiday books. At various times throughout the year, we often have a large inventory of discarded Library books that we sell at discounted prices.

All proceeds from the Second Hand Prose Bookshop benefit programs funded by the Friends, such as the Books for Babies Program, Artist Reception Program, and the purchase of computers and reference materials for the Library.
