

FPL Supports Art and Culture in Portland

When it comes to art and culture, no one will confuse Portland, Connecticut with New York, London or Paris. But there are many opportunities for local residents to experience art and culture by taking advantage of various Library programs funded by the Friends of the Portland Library. For example, you can pick up Museum Passes at the Portland Library that provide free admission to several excellent Connecticut art museums. You also can view an art show or attend one of FPL's Artist Receptions in the Library's Mary Flood Room. Perhaps you could choose a DVD of your favorite opera, Broadway show or classic movie from the Library's extensive DVD collection. Or attend one of the many FPL-funded art, music or literature programs offered for adults or children at the Library.

FPL's Museum Pass Program provides free admission to four outstanding Connecticut art museums. Hartford's Wadsworth Atheneum, America's oldest public art museum, boasts an impressive collection of European, American and Contemporary art, along with an extensive Costume and Textile Collection. At the 152 acre Hill-Stead Museum in Farmington, you can experience paintings by Degas, Cassatt, Whistler and Monet and wonderful ceramics and furniture, all set in the Pope family's comfortable and livable home. The New Britain Museum of American Art, the first museum dedicated strictly to American Art, now has a collection of over 10,000 pieces that spans from John Trumbull to Georgia O'Keefe and beyond. Finally, you can visit the home of American Impressionism and the famous Lyme Art Colony at the Florence Griswold Museum in Old Lyme. Passes can be reserved online at www.portlandlibraryct.org, by phone (342-6770) or by visiting Portland Library.

The Library's Mary Flood Room not only serves as the main venue for Town meetings and community groups, but also as the home of art shows by talented local artists. Recent shows include works by the students of Watercolor Creations

(an art school in Cromwell), members of Brownstone Arts (a local artists' group) and the photographer Carolyn Astle. FPL sponsors an Artist Reception for each art show, and beverages and homemade baked goods are always served. Please check the *Rivereast* or the Library's website for information on featured artists and reception dates and times.

FPL funds the entire cost of Portland Library's impressive DVD collection. From *The Pirates of Penzance* to *Pirates of the Caribbean*, from *La Boheme* to *Phantom of the Opera*, from *Pride and Prejudice* to *Lawrence of Arabia*, the Library's collection contains something for everyone.

FPL finances many children's, family and adult programs throughout the year. In 2010, FPL has funded Library programs on memoir writing, puppetry, hula dancing, marine biology, magic, Mark Twain, doodling, basketball and music. We also have funded both the Children's and Adult Summer Reading Programs. For the past two years, FPL also has served as the organizing sponsor of Family Shakespeare, a program that brings a professional Shakespeare production to Portland each August.

All of these programs are possible only because of the generous support of our members. With significant cuts to the Library's budget in recent years, FPL's role has become more crucial than ever. The Friends held another very successful book sale during the weekend of October 22-24. The Annual Book Sale, which is our largest fundraising event (other than our Membership Drive), raised almost \$3,000 this year. This is a \$300 increase from 2009.

We made some changes this year. Instead of holding the book sale at both the Library and the Senior Center, we consolidated the operation to just one location--the Library. The unexpected closure of the Library's main entrance due to the sidewalk improvement project required a last minute change in our set up. Yet, the sale went very smoothly, and we truly appreciate everyone's patience with this issue. Also, in FPL's continuing effort to "go green," all members who came on Friday night received an FPL logo recyclable bag to carry their selections home. We hope to see these bags around town as our members shop and visit the Library in support of our other events.

As always, setting up the Annual Book Sale was our first challenge. Our small but eager group of volunteers worked in earnest Thursday afternoon to get the Library ready for the sale. Under the direction of Phyllis Greene and Bob Casati, veteran book sale organizers, the books flew quickly from the truck on to the tables.

When the doors opened on a chilly Friday evening, a line of anxious buyers was patiently waiting to search the tables for their favorite authors, or discover a rare edition, or settle in with a classic. Sales were brisk throughout the weekend, and the Friends donated all remaining books and tapes to Connecticut Easter Seals.

The Friends would not be able to run a successful Annual Book Sale without the help of a veritable army of volunteers. This year's volunteers included students from PMS, PHS, Xavier High School, Mercy High School and St. Mary's CCD program, and staff from the Portland Library and the Public Works Department. Many thanks to Portland Fire Department Companies #1 and #2 for the use of their tables and to Portland Library and BIS for the use of their facilities. Finally, we would like to thank the many Friends' members who spent countless hours organizing, planning and executing the event.

All the books, puzzles, videos, DVDs and CDs sold at the event were collected throughout the year, thanks to generous donations from Portland residents. The Friends are already making plans for next year's Annual Book Sale. We eagerly await your donations and will be holding our next collection on Thursday, December 2nd. The "Read and Recycle" events are held on the first Thursday of each month at BIS from 3-6 pm (July and August, 1-3 pm). Thank you so much for your support.
