# A Letter from the President

Dear Friends:

Autumn is always a busy time of year for the Friends of the Portland Library. Hopefully, you were able to attend the Brownstone Festival in September and our Fall Book Sale in October. As you will read elsewhere in this newsletter, both of these events were very successful. In addition, the preparation and distribution of this town-wide newsletter is a major undertaking for our small Executive Board.

Now it is time to launch our 2009 membership drive. Your contributions to the Friends help to provide those items that make Portland Library such a very special place. Both the Library's DVD collection and the popular Museum Pass Program are funded entirely by the generosity of our 425 members. But these programs are expensive to run. 


New members are always welcome at TAB meetings. Interested students must be in grades 6 or higher to attend. Please contact the Youth Services Department at the Library for more information.

# **Another Successful Annual Book Sale for the Friends**

Books, Books and more Books! The Friends held another very successful Annual Book Sale during the weekend of October 17-19, 2008. The Annual Book Sale, which is our largest fundraising event (other than our Membership Drive), raised approximately \$2800 this year.

All the books, puzzles, videos, DVDs and CDs sold at the event were collected throughout the year thanks to generous donations from the public. This year, the Friends received so many donations that the truck used to transport them from the storage facilities at BIS to the Library and the Senior Center was heaving under the weight of the full boxes. Our small but eager group of volunteers worked in earnest Thursday afternoon to get the sites ready. Under the direction of Phyllis Greene and Bob Casati, veteran book sale organizers, the books flew quickly from the truck on to the tables. When the doors opened on Friday evening, a line of anxious buyers was patiently waiting to search the tables to select their favorite authors, or discover a rare edition, or settle in with a classic. Sales were brisk throughout the weekend, and the Friends donated all remaining books and tapes to the United Way and a local orphanage.

The Friends would not be able to run a successful Annual Book Sale without the help of a veritable army of volunteers. This year's volunteers included students from PMS, PHS and Xavier High School, representatives of Boy Scout Troop #2, Girl Scout Troop, St. Mary's CCD program and Portland's Teen Advisory Council, Youth Action Council, Public Works Department and Library. In addition, we need to thank Portland Fire Department Company #1 for the use of their sturdy tables, Tri-Town and Country Market for the donated bags and Portland Library, Senior Center and BIS for the use of their facilities.
