FPL's Book Sale Raises More Than \$2,000

Portland was buzzing with excitement and plenty of activity on Friday, October 25. Along with the costumed trick-or-treaters enjoying Portland's Halloween Downtown event, book enthusiasts lined up at the Library for FPL's Annual Book Sale.

The Friends held another successful book sale that weekend (October 25-27), and raised more than \$2,000 to support Library programs. The Annual Book Sale, which is FPL's largest fundraising event (other than the Membership Drive), is a much anticipated event for many area residents. It's a great opportunity to stock up on reading material for the upcoming long winter season. With blizzards, a hurricane, a tropical storm and extended power outages over the past few years, it's always a good idea to have a good supply of reading material on hand!

We received a large quantity of donated materials at our four Read & Recycle collection events this year, so setting up the Book Sale was quite a challenge. Our small but eager group of volunteers worked in earnest Thursday afternoon and evening to move the books from our storage facility to the Library, where they were quickly loaded on to tables.

Sales were steady throughout the weekend, and the Friends donated all remaining books, games, puzzles and audiovisual materials to other local charitable organizations, such as Connecticut Easter Seals, Goodwill Industries and local schools, who will use these materials to supplement their programs.

The Friends would not be able to run a successful Annual Book Sale without our volunteers. This year's volunteers included students from St. Mary's CCD program, PMS, PHS, Mercy and Xavier High Schools, and staff from the Public Works Department and the Portland Library. Many thanks to Portland Fire Department Company #1 for the use of their tables and to Portland Library and BIS for the use of their facilities. Finally, we would like to thank the many Friends' members who spent countless hours organizing, planning and executing the event.

The PHS Portfolio Art Show will include watercolors, acrylics, oils, pastels, pencil drawings, charcoal drawings and scratchboard works. A reception date will be announced in the Library newsletter and in the *Rivereast News Bulletin*.

The Portland Schools Youth Art Exhibit will grace the Mary Flood Room during the months of March and April. The Exhibit will feature art by talented students from all five Portland Public Schools. A reception will be held for the students, their families, teachers and friends on Thursday, March 13 from 4-6 pm at the Library.

In May, the artwork of Paula Slym will be displayed at the Library. Paula is a self-taught artist who specializes in acrylics and watercolors. She is a member of both the Art Guild of Middletown and the Glastonbury Art Guild. A reception will take place on Saturday, May 3 from 2-4 pm in the Mary Flood Room.

FPL Funds Programs for Children, Teens and Families

In 2012, The Friends of the Portland Library channeled more than \$35,000 into Library programs that benefit Portland citizens of all ages. From infants to seniors, FPL seeks to enrich the lives of all Portland residents. We are especially proud, however, of the contributions that our organization makes to Library programs supporting children, teens and families. Through these programs, we hope to foster in Portland's young people a love of learning, community and libraries that will last a lifetime.

FPL's "Books for Babies" program targets Portland's tiniest citizens. Through this program, every new Portland baby can receive a free kit that includes a Touch and Feel board book, a Books for Babies bib, a Babies First Library Card, and brochures that provide families with tips on how to raise a child who loves reading and writing. See the article on page 3 for further information.

The Library's Museum Pass Program (funded entirely by the Friends) allows families to visit many local museums and attractions for free or at significantly reduced admission. For families with younger children, we offer passes to the Imagine Nation Museum, the Lutz Museum and KidCity. Nature lovers can select from passes to the Beardsley Zoo, the Roger Williams Zoo, the Mystic Aquarium and the Roaring Brook Nature Center. Families who wish to explore Connecticut's rich history can choose from passes to Mystic Seaport, the Mashantucket Pequot Museum, the Mark Twain House and Museum and the Harriet Beecher Stowe Center. And, since it's never too early to instill a love of art in a child, why not plan a family trip to the Wadsworth Atheneum, the New Britain Museum of American Art or the Florence Griswold Museum? See the article on page 3 for a full list of available passes.

This year, FPL funded the entire cost of the Library's Summer Reading Program, along with a wide variety of children's and family programs held throughout the year. This year's programs have included magic shows, family music concerts, a visit by a local author, animal shows and environmental programs. FPL also pays for the program supplies, craft materials and snacks for the Library's Story Time programs and all programs for children's and teens. We fund hundreds of "prize" books for Summer Reading Program participants who reach their reading goals. All told, FPL budgets approximately \$8,500 for these fun and educational programs.

It is especially important that Portland's teens feel at home at the Library. To this end, FPL joined with the Library Board last year to finance a complete overhaul of the Library's Teen Area. New carpet, shelving and furniture give the area a fresh, up-to-date look and provide Portland's teens with a comfortable, welcoming and functional place to call their own. FPL's contribution to the project totaled approximately \$8,000.

Last, but certainly not least, FPL funds the purchase of books for holiday gift baskets given to families served by the Portland Food Bank. Each year, FPL provides hundreds of high quality, age appropriate books for infants, children and teens. In this small way, FPL is proud to support the efforts of Ruth Maio (Director of the Portland Food Bank) as she works tirelessly to make Portland a stronger community.

Of course, FPL continues to support many other Library programs for patrons of all ages. We fund the Library's entire DVD collection (\$12,000 budgeted for 2013) and purchase e-books, software and reference materials (collectively, \$6,000 budgeted for 2013). FPL funds Artist Receptions and adult programs on such diverse topics as vampires, coupons and laughter. We also provide prizes for the Adult Summer Reading Program and refreshments for adult programs held throughout the year.

All of these programs are possible only because of the generous support of our members. With the tight Library budgets of recent years, FPL's role has become more crucial than ever. Find Bargains at the Friends' Second Hand Prose Bookshop

When visiting the Library, be sure to browse the Friends' Second Hand Prose Book Sale area. We have mysteries, general fiction, non-fiction, romance, young adult and children's used books, as well as used DVDs and videos. Many items are like new and would make great gifts. Hardcover books sell for \$2.00 and trade paperbacks (such as those from Oprah Winfrey's book club selections) cost \$1.00. Paperbacks and books for children and young adults sell for \$0.50. DVDs cost \$3.00 and videos sell for \$1.00. We also sell discarded books from the Library's collection for only \$0.50 each. New treasures arrive each week!

FPL also holds several targeted book sales in the Second Hand Prose Bookshop during regular library hours throughout the year. In February, when "Love is in the Air" at the Portland Library, we offer hundreds of romance novels for sale. Our Bookshop features a collection of gardening books, cookbooks, craft books, and travel books in the spring. During June and July, patrons can stock up on paperback books for their vacation reading at the annual Books for the Beach sale. The Holiday Book Store, which is held on the first Saturday in December, starts our month long sale of gift quality used books including coffee table books and children's holiday books. At various times throughout the year, we often have a large inventory of discarded Library books that we sell at discounted prices.

All proceeds from the Second Hand Prose Bookshop benefit programs funded by the Friends, such as the Books for Babies Program, Artist Reception Program, and the purchase of computers and reference materials for the Library.
